Research

In the industry area, you may access research reports and information that contributes to the long-term success of the industry, ranging from research into watermelon disease control and prevention, pest control and prevention, to food safety and nutrition research.

American Heart Association Certification

The NWPB has worked with the American Heart Association to create PLU labels for red seeded and red seedless watermelon that display the heart checkmark. According to the AHA, nearly 90 percent of consumers find the heart checkmark helpful when making purchasing decisions. The heart checkmark helps boost sales, which translates into moving more watermelons cut of the growers' fields and into consumers' homes. From the main section, click on Resources to find out how you can use this tool in your own marketing materials.

News from the National Watermelon Promotion Board

Facts about Chef Harry and the Watermelon Bus

During the NWPB spring Board of Directors meeting we discussed the bus that Chef Harry uses to make watermelon-promoting appearances. One of our board members mentioned that there are some misunderstandings about the bus in the watermelon community and suggested that we should make sure everyone knows how the arrangement is set up. So we'd like to take this opportunity to clear up any misconceptions about the watermelon bus.

Here are the facts:

NWPB did not buy the bus. NWPB did not buy the bus for Chef Harry.

Nor did NWPB lease the bus. NWPB did not enter into any agreement tied in with a lease or ownership of the bus.

Chef Harry leases the bus from the bus company and his signature is on all documents related to the lease of the bus.

Chef Harry uses the bus to get to special appearances and media interviews arranged by NWPB, and for his book tour that promotes a healthy lifestyle for kids, including eating lots of watermelon.

He uses the bus instead of traveling by airplane, staying in hotel rooms, renting cars and eating meals in restaurants. When we added up travel costs for him two years ago it was much more than the cost of using a bus. He now stays in campgrounds, paying small nightly fees, and prepares most meals at his "home" on wheels.

The bus has four huge photographs of watermelon recipes and carvings on its sides and three huge photographs of Chef Harry in the kitchen with watermelon on the side and back. It also has the watermelon.org web address on it and the message "Watermelon. Health and Delicious. Everyday." on it so it's a rolling advertisement for watermelon.

The bus has served as a backdrop for many on-camera appearances as well as being a rolling billboard for watermelon seen by thousands of consumers as he's driven down the highway.

The Food Network program "Unwrapped" shot a segment with Chef Harry and the bus scheduled to air this April because they were so interested in the idea of a chef that traveled in a bus, promoting watermelon!

Chef Harry continues to do a great job for watermelon and the bus is one more way that we've worked together to promote watermelon.

BIG SECRETS!

The 2006 Watermelon Convention Season has come to an end. After attending 7 of the 9 state chapter conventions this year, I realized quickly that our chapters are doing some great things to raise donations and promote watermelon in their state(s) during the watermelon season. To varying degrees, there is success in every chapter that I visited this year, and have heard of the success in the two chapters that I will be with next year.

One may ask, "what did we learn from this year's conventions?" That question is one that hopefully many of you will ask of your fellow chapters. There are so many good things going on across the country, yet most seem to be a BIG SECRET!

Well, as the old adage states, "the cat's out of the bag". I am encouraging every chapter to talk with others to share ideas and successes, what worked and what didn't work, so that we can help one another to make the conventions work even better for all concerned. I for one will talk about this subject every place that I go this year to get the good news out, and hopefully get many of you to pick up the telephone and ask others how they did.

For instance:

--Ask MARDEL how they raised over \$30,000 in sponsorships for their convention in February before they even got to the convention site!

--Ask Florida about their promotion with the Department of Agriculture that included Billboard Advertising, Restaurant Placemats and much more!

--Ask North Carolina about their extensive advertising promotion with the Department of Agriculture that included Advertising on Radio, Buses, Tractor Trailers and Billboards!

--Ask Illiana about their investment in Disease Research at Purdue University, and how they designated watermelon loads at their convention auction to raise the needed funds.

--Ask Florida about their investment in Disease Research at the University of Florida, and what they are trying to accomplish for the entire NWA.

--Ask North and South Carolina how and why they are so successful in bringing retailers into their conventions and auctions, and purchasing the loads at extremely high prices!

--Ask MOARK about their grower meeting in Kennett, Missouri the day before their convention begins, and what that means to their growth as a chapter.

--Ask about so much more of ANY CHAPTER. This is only the tip of the iceberg of the things that are working so well for the chapters, and could be duplicated with a high degree of success in all of them.

--Support MoArk by sharing insights that will help them in their efforts to rebuild a State Queen Program in their chapter in 2007!

NWA SUGGESTION

Would it be possible to share some of the ideas and promotional events that are working or being done by the chapters in The Vineline? I think so. Here's how:

Please consider carving out a "small" section of the 'free' state chapter page and add items of interest that talk about the promotions, the research investments, the convention ideas, etc. that your chapter is doing successfully. Adding the other elements of your chapter on to the Chapter Queen Report page will not take anything away from the Queen Program, but rather will complete the page to be representative of all that your chapter is doing each month/year, what your chapter should be proud of, and want to share.

I challenge each chapter to consider how they can and will share their good ideas, and utilize The Vineline as a prime method to share them with your fellow chapters throughout the year.

Public Affairs

The NWA has sent a letter to every U.S. Senator and U.S. Congressional office in support of the Lane Agricultural Research Station in Lane, Oklahoma. The 2007 fiscal budget proposal arrived on Capitol Hill with some budget cuts for the USDA, including the closing of the Lane Research Station in the fall of 2006.

If we were to lose the Lane facility and the scientific team working on watermelon research, we would lose over 100

collective years of experience and take a giant leap backwards as a result. We can only hope at this point that our letters (and possibly some from individual members) may have saved the lab, and kept Dr. Benny Bruton and others on watermelon research at Lane in the future.

Additionally, the Association Health Plan (AHP) bill, which passed in the U.S. House late last year, is being debated in the U.S. Senate. The NWA joined with 120 other associations/organizations with over 80 million employees to send letters of support to every Senate office. The AHP bill will allow groups like the NWA to negotiate health care coverage plans similar to what large corporations and labor organizations can do.

We are hopeful that the Senate can work through the AHP bill, and pass it, awaiting the President's signature. AHP is part of President Bush's health care reform package, and was referenced during his last State of the Union Address to the nation. Any letters to your Senators in Washington in support of AHP (S.858) would be very helpful. The NWA office can provide a suggested letter if you would like to help.

Scientific Research

The NWA has invested in two scientific research projects for 2006. They are:

(1) Vine Decline research with multiple agencies and labs, especially the University of Florida Research Station in Immokalee, Florida. The field trials have been planted and will surround a field investigation of the newly identified virus as well as white fly management. If your chapter has not invested into this project yet, please encourage your leaders to do so. This one disease has already caused grower losses in excess of \$25 million, and needs to be stopped before it spreads any further. Your help will allow us to accelerate the research and gain ground on this issue. Thank you to those chapters that have already supported the NWA in this endeavor.

(2) Phytophthora research will continue at North Carolina State University as a result of the positive feedback from last year's project and the use of Captan. Although Captan is not an approved usage method for watermelon, we are hopeful that as the research progresses, and Captan is a method that will help as a cure, that we can gain that approval for watermelon usage.

Dr. Gerald Holmes and Dr. Bill Jester are determined and excited about this year's prospects in the expansion of their research.

Both of these projects will be expressed in detail later this year in future issues of The Vineline.

Membership Goals

Setting goals in our lives (whether they are personal; social or business) are what drives all of us. But, did you know that only 20% of goals are ever reached because they are NOT written down? Yet, if we write them down and put them in front of our eyes to see each day, we increase our odds of making the goal up to 49%!

What does that all mean? Well, I have established a WRITTEN GOAL for me (and the NWA). I look at it each day, and will talk about it constantly while working toward achieving it. It is an aggressive goal, and one that I MAY NOT BE ABLE TO DO ON MY OWN! That's right; I may not be able to do it on my own. But, I can easily do it WITH YOUR HELP! Do you want to know how?

Just ask your self how many growers, shippers, brokers, retailers, and suppliers (bins, seed, chemicals, irrigation, farm equipment, bankers, investors, etc.) that you know and/or do business with in the Watermelon Business. If you are doing business with them, or are friends with them, then you may have some leverage to get them involved with your chapter (and the NWA as a result).

For example, if you are a farmer/grower, you most definitely have leverage over great numbers of people/companies. Who do you purchase tractors, irrigation equipment, mulch beds/plastic, fertilizer, pesticides and other chemicals, trucks, trailers, and much more from? Every one of your suppliers is a potential member that maybe should be a part of this organization.

If you are a shipper, broker or supplier,

you may have some leverage as well, but more importantly you have a great many contacts. You have valued relationships that have the door open so that you can offer the opportunity for others to consider joining. Not everyone will join the chapter and/or NWA, but some will, I assure you.

The same goes for corrugated bin folks, and seed company folks and so many more supplier members. Your customer base is far more extensive than our membership lists currently are. If one of your customers is in the Watermelon business, why can't they be offered and encouraged to look at the opportunity as a member of the NWA?

CAUTION If we pass this responsibility off to others, then we may end up with very, very few people working on the goal at all. All that this effort will take is a few phone calls from you to others that you know. We all get busy during the season, and the effort will be passed over because of our other priorities. Please, please consider helping your chapter by making a few calls TODAY (at least one call), and helping us to EXCEED the GOAL of 200 NEW MEMBERS in 2006!

USDA GRANTS AVAILABLE

Attention all State Chapters. Secretary of Agriculture Michael Johanns recently announced the availability of \$7 million in specialty crop grants through the State's Departments of Agriculture. Each State is eligible to receive a minimum of \$100,000, and larger agriculture states are also eligible for amounts that are proportionate to the value of specialty crop production.

This Specialty Crop Block Grant Program is designed "to enhance the competitiveness of specialty crops", which are defined as fruits and vegetables, tree nuts, dried fruits and nursery crops.

Every Watermelon producing state in the country is eligible, and should be contacted ASAP to get Watermelon on their radar screen. And, for those chapters that have members in multiple states, you should contact each State's Department of Agriculture where you have members.

Watermelon should be part of this block grant program in most of the states

across the country, but it won't be if we don't ask. You won't get anything unless you ask for it. Let us know if you need the contact information in each state, and we'll provide that to you. Good luck!


