

Off To The Races




Driving for New Members

gratitude that we have for you.





NWA Update

Could this be the year in D.C.?

As of this publication date, we have finished work with our Congressional Leaders in Washington on two vital pieces of legislation that will effect us all. They are Comprehensive Immigration reform, and the 2007 Farm Bill. This year (hopefully) promises to bring us resolution to a long debate, and a sorely needed guest worker program that will provide migrant labor to our members in their fields and sheds. And, the 2007 farm bill will be a hot topic for the remainder of the spring and summer months for sure.

Comprehensive Immigration Reform

In March, the U.S. House introduced H.R. 371, the AgJobs bill, with the purpose to legalize migrant workers primarily from our country's southern neighbors, and keep agriculture working. Agriculture has been carrying this torch



for many, many years, and is the sole benefactor of this legislation as a result.

Also in March, the U.S. Senate introduced S. 340, the AgJobs bill, with the same purpose and hopeful result. Both bills are very similar in nature.

YOU CAN HELP US!!!! How? Please log on to the NWA web site, and go into the Legislative Affairs section. You will find some key information that we use in Washington as selling points to encourage our legislators to support our needs. On the web site you can click on a link that will connect you to your legislator's web sites, and send them an email encouraging them to support this legislation. Please contact your legislator and set the expectation for them. You letters, emails and calls count! They must listen before watermelon is effected as adversely as other crops already have been.

2007 Farm Bill

In March, the U.S. House introduced "the Equitable Agriculture Today for a Healthy America Act", other wise known as EAT Healthy America Act. This has been a labor of love and commitment for the NWA and 17 other agriculture (fruit & vegetable) groups, all working in unison for the past 20 months. This legislation has been embraced by USDA Secretary Mike Johanns, and for the most part, is included in his proposal that he presented to Congress in February.



Also in March, the U.S. Senate introduced "the Specialty Crop Competition Act of 2007" which is the Senate version of our bill. It, too, is very similar to the House version, and provides the same benefits to fruit and vegetables like watermelon, commonly referred to as specialty crops.

Overall, the legislation keys on a significant increase in U.S. Farm Policy spending on specialty crops through investments and improvements in disaster assistance programs, conservation programs, farmland protection programs, market access programs, research investments, grant program increases for marketing and research, food safety, nutrition program expansions (WIC, food stamps, and DOD purchasing), renewable energy programs, specialty crop block grants, and much more.

YOU CAN HELP US!!!!!!!! How? Again, as is the case with immigration reform and a guest worker program, contact your legislators and tell them that you need their support. Specialty crops have the same farm gate value that program crops do, yet only receive 6% of the crop value of the previous farm bill. This legislation provides a more equitable distribution of farm funding, and will allow groups like ours to pursue multiple opportunities that will help us to compete in a highly competitive market. Tell your elected officials what you expect. That is what they are there for; to represent your best interests.

Access Voluntary Food Safety Guidelines for the Watermelon Industry

These Guidelines serve to assure your buyers you are doing everything possible to ensure safe product. Did you know we have them in English and Spanish?

» Research

In the industry area, you may access research reports and information that contributes to the long-term success of the industry, ranging from research into watermelon disease control and prevention, pest control and prevention, to food safety and nutrition research.

» American Heart Association Certification

The NWPB has worked with the American Heart Association to create PLU labels for red seeded and red seedless watermelon that display the heart checkmark. According to the AHA, nearly 90 percent of consumers find the heart checkmark helpful when making purchasing decisions. The heart checkmark helps boost sales, which translates into moving more watermelons out of the growers' fields and into consumers' homes. From the main section, click on Resources to find out how you can use this tool in your own marketing materials.

News from the National Watermelon Promotion Board

National Watermelon Promotion Board (NWPB) Supported in Assessment Increase Recommendation

At the spring board meeting of the NWPB, there was an overwhelming vote of confidence for the first ever assessment rate increase. This board vote serves as our move to make the recommendation to the Secretary of Agriculture to review the assessment request and to initiate the Rule Making process. The decision was made by a NWPB Board Member vote, not a referendum, because an increase recommendation does not fall under one of the four referendum categories laid out in the Watermelon Research and Promotion Act. Congressional approval is needed to change the Act to include referendums to increase the assessment rate; the Plan, however, allows for a vote to submit requests for Rule Making to the Secretary. A notification will be made in the Federal Register and a then comment period will be opened to the industry. Be assured, the NWPB will inform the industry through newsletters and the website when the comment period is open for remarks, but this is still some months off.

Necessary Increase

The assessment rate has been 4ϕ per cwt since the beginning of the program.; the recommended rate is for a 6ϕ per cwt assessment. Since 1995, with inflation and cost increases, we have lost 25% of our effective buying power. Continued inflationary pressure threatens the effectiveness of the program, weakening watermelon's position in the marketplace. Our budget is one of the smallest of all national check-off programs. The recommended rate increase is 1ϕ per cwt for the grower, 1ϕ per cwt for the handler, and a 2ϕ per cwt increase on imports (covering both grower and handler).

New Programming with Funds

The new funds will be spent in the following areas, to name a few: More food safety and crisis communications; more television and children's programs; new retail and food service promotions; additional event sponsorship opportunities; increased health professional outreach; research including citrulline, watermelon user profile, juice blend study and new product testing; new food service database; increase export program funding; new trade ad campaign; consumer watermelon research including food safety awareness, nutrition, and preferences; new product development programs; and, business information services, providing key data to industry including product movement, retail prices and publication of various market analyses.

The proposed increase was supported by the National Watermelon Association (NWA) executive committee and it was ratified by the NWA membership who attended the national convention the week ending February 24, 2007. The NWPB expects the process of review, comment, and approval to take several months. 


