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LA NIÑA WATCH ISSUED

A La Niña watch has been issued by the Southeast Climate Consortium and the state climatologists of Alabama, Florida and Georgia. A watch means that conditions are likely for the development of a full-fledged La Niña event. The watch will be followed by an official La Niña declaration if development continues in the next couple of months.

The tropical Pacific Ocean is now poised to slip into a full-fledged La Niña. Chances are very good that La Niña conditions will develop, strengthen and persist through the fall and winter months. This follows months of cooler than normal water temperatures near the coast of South America.

La Niña is commonly thought of as the opposite of El Niño. Under La Niña conditions, sea surface temperatures along the equator in the eastern and central Pacific Ocean are a few degrees colder than normal for a minimum of five





ranging from exceptional across much of Alabama and Georgia to moderate in south Florida, will continue and possibly worsen throughout the winter and into next spring.

If below normal rainfall occurs during the cool season, moisture recharge of groundwater, soils, ponds and reservoirs will be limited. Most Southeastern states depend on water recharge during the cool season.

Farmers who plan to plant and do not have adequate irrigation capability have a high risk of being seriously impacted by the winter drought. In addition the risk of increased wildfires should be expected during the winter and spring wildfire season in Florida, South Georgia, and lower Alabama.

The Southeast Climate Consortium has estimated the impacts on climate based on past La Niña events. For central Florida, the probability of normal or above rainfall for January 2008 is only 8 percent. The chance of moderately dry (rainfall amounts from just below normal to half of normal) is 20 percent, and for very dry conditions (less than half of normal rainfall) is 72 percent.

For the Panhandle of Florida, South Georgia, and lower Alabama the probability of normal or above rainfall in January 2008 is 20 percent, for moderately dry 50 percent, and for very dry 30 percent.

JOHANNS RESIGNS: RUNS FOR SENATE

U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Mike Johanns (R) resigned from his Cabinet post and will run in 2008 for the U.S. Senate seat being vacated by Chuck Hagel (R-Neb.) In his capacity as the USDA Secretary during the Bush Administration, Johanns has taken a valued roll in the development of farm bill legislation to include farm policy reform, specialty crop recognition, and fiscal management of the People's Department.

Although we are sad to see our Secretary depart, we send our thanks for all of his supportive efforts and leadership, and wish him the best of luck in his run for the U.S. Senate, representing the State of Nebraska.

His decision sets up a potential battle with former Democratic Sen. Bob Kerrey, who is mulling a run. Johanns would first face challenges in the GOP primary from several candidates, including state Attorney General Jon Bruning.

Johanns had been expected to jump into the race but had refused to comment on the possibility until Hagel announced he would not run for a third term.

A former Nebraska governor and Lincoln mayor, Johanns became a Republican in the late 1980s. He became Agriculture secretary in 2005.



Chuck Conner, USDA Deputy Secretary, has been asked to be the Acting USDA Secretary for the remainder of the Bush Administration. Chuck is from a farming family that grows corn and soybeans in Indiana, with the farm run by his brother, Mike. Conner is a friend of our industry, and is considered by many to be the architect of farm policy for many years. Chuck is pictured as he recently addressed the NWA and United Fresh Produce Association during the Public Policy Conference in mid-September.

FOOD SAFETY LEGISLATION

Senator Tom Harkin, Chairman of the Senate Agriculture Committee, has

been a long champion of the need to increase consumption of fruits and vegetables to improve public health, as well as a strong supporter of food safety measures to assure that the public enjoys the safest, highest quality fruits and vegetables possible.

Harkin has introduced legislation in which the government can be even more effective in ensuring safety and also raising public confidence to increase their consumption of fresh fruits and vegetables.

We recognize that our products are grown naturally in an open, outdoor environment, in which zero risk is our overwhelming goal, but cannot be a scientific certainty. That's where strong scientific oversight by government is essential in assuring the public that industry is meeting the most demanding standards in everything we do. In the event that we do detect a potential problem, we also work aggressively with the government to recall potentially harmful products to prevent actual illness to the consumer. It's important to recognize that a proactive recall to prevent illness is a positive step, and a frequent occurrence throughout all sectors of the broader food industry. Yet, prevention of any potential contamination from field to fork is our first priority.

We see some elements of Harkin's bill that we believe could be useful steps, and others that may be well-intentioned but not productive in enhancing public health and safety. For example, we support greater FDA oversight in ensuring that strong Good Agricultural Practices are developed and applied to various commodities based on potential risk. In addition, we support the call for greater public education and research in the area of produce food safety, and a commitment that domestic and imported produce meet the same safety standards regardless of point of origin. At the same time, some of the suggestions in the legislation are overly



prescriptive calling for on-farm management systems that would offer limited value in assuring food safety. We believe those are the types of issues and recommendations that are best determined in cooperation with scientists at the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the FDA, rather than in legislation.

Although Harkin's bill has been introduced, we are anticipating that it will not gain any traction for many months to come. Our industry intends to work with Senator Harkin and other Congressional leaders to ensure that we are indeed taking all steps needed to grow and market the safest possible produce, and give consumers the confidence they need to increase their consumption of fruits and vegetables to meet the U.S. Dietary Guidelines, reduce the incidence of obesity, and improve their long-term health.




California Marketing Trip

This is a breakthrough for us because ASDA is owned by Wal-Mart; therefore ASDA will accept watermelons that meet Wal-Mart's standards, in lieu of EureGAP standards. A pre-qualified shipment of US watermelons by a Wal-Mart approved vendor will have an easier process of shipping and receiving in customs.

Teacher's Tool Kits Flying Off the Shelf....Again!





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
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Illiana Report






